Summer Project

Create a **power point or booklet** that demonstrates your understanding of your summer reading.

Your project must contain the following components:



1) Main Character Analysis

Choose 1 character from the novel:

- a) Identify (3) features of the character's appearance
- b) List (3) internal and/or external character conflicts.
- c) Identify & explain a quote that speaks to the character's personality
 - d) Draw a symbol or image of the character.

2) Theme Analysis

Discuss in a paragraph the theme(s) of the novel (5 sentences minimum).

3) Novel's Setting

Choose a significant setting in the novel:

- a) Draw an illustration of the setting
 - b) Give a quote describing it.
- c) Describe a significant event that takes place in the setting (1-2 sentences).

4) Meaningful Quote

Choose a quote from the novel that is meaningful to you: Discuss the quotes' significance in the novel & to you (1-2 sentences).

5) Project Appearance

Projects (whether ppt or booklet) needs to be thoughtful and creative; avoid using pencil on looseleaf lined paper:

- a) the ppt should have various slides for each section with clear titles & fonts
 - b) The ppt should have a cover slide and an end slide.
- c) A paper booklet will be **written in ink or typed**, and the images colored.
- d) The paper should be (choose one) copy paper (may be white or colored), construction paper, or card stock (no lined or graph paper).
 - e) The book should be bound or stapled to look like a book.
