## FREE APPLICATION FOR FEDERAL STUDENT AID (FAFSA)

You must complete and submit a FAFSA to apply for federal student aid and to apply for most state aid and college aid after <u>October 1 of senior</u> <u>year.</u> Applying online with FAFSA on the Web at <u>www.studentaid.gov</u> is faster and easier than using a paper FAFSA.

- Students, parents, and borrowers are required to use an FSA ID, made up of a username and password, to access certain U.S. Department of Education websites. Your FSA ID is used to confirm your identity when accessing your financial aid information and electronically signing your federal student aid documents.

You will need the following information to complete the FAFSA:

- Your Social Security Number and your parent's Social Security Numbers.
- Your driver's license number if you have one.
- Your Alien Registration Number if you are not a U.S. citizen
- 2024 federal tax information or tax returns (including IRS W-2 information) for yourself (and spouse if you are married) and for your parents if you are providing parental information.
- Information on savings, investments, and business and farm assets for yourself and your parents if you are providing parental information.
